Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome to week 10 of Term 3. Amazingly our first full term at school for 2020!

It has certainly been an interesting year so far as we experience being part of a pivotal point in history.

The inspiration for my newsletter articles is often influenced by my discussions with parents, teachers and students and this week is no exception.

Last Thursday morning I was the recipient of eight very persuasive arguments on ways the school could be made better. The arguments put forward were well presented with research to support the ideas discussed and were delivered with passion and zeal.

The presenters - Anthony, Nathan, Jordan, Charlotte, Sydney, Alex, Jazz and Anika were great advocates for Year 4 in representing the work being done in class.

Their ideas for St Monica's included updating and further integrating technology to keep pace with 21st century learning, different interest clubs at school to engage the students in a variety of learning opportunities, the introduction of chickens to complement the veggie garden, a therapy dog, updating the handball courts to improve the recent handball competition and expand the ways we can get children to connect and work together and even introducing a recycling program that could potentially earn the school \$700 a year to put towards other ideas.

The discussion held after the 'pitch' about their ideas was very impressive!

All are 'doable' and many are already in the pipeline for next term and into 2021. I always feel encouraged and buoyed by the enthusiasm and intellect shown by the next generation of our community and know that we will continue to have active citizens making the world a better place.

"Tell Them From Me" (TTFM) Survey.

As a school we are now reviewing the information received from the recent TTFM survey. The reports have now been received at school and in Term 4 we will share the feedback.

We had 47 families respond to the survey to assist us with understanding better the parents' experience and perceptions of school. The survey also included the student and staff perspectives.

SCHOOL LEAVERS

We are planning for the 2021 school year and to help us with this please let the office know if your family will not be continuing at St Monica's in 2021. A reminder to families that a term's notice (10 school weeks) in writing **MUST** be given to the principal before the removal of a student or a full term's fees will be payable. The notice can be given any time during the term for the next term and where appropriate notice has been received, a pro-rate credit will be calculated. Where a term's notice has not been given to the principal, the term's school fees will be charged for your child/children.



SCHOOL FEES

Changes to Family Levy

We advise that your school fee statement may look a little different next year. You will notice that the Resource Fee has increased and there is no longer a Family Levy as the Family Levy and Resource Fee have merged. In the majority of cases this has little or no impact. For families with 3 or more students there will be a slight increase in the combination of these fees. For 2021 there will be no increase in diocesan tuition fees or the building levy and therefore you will find that the total school fees increase is within the bounds of normal annual increases. Contact the school office if you require any further information.

At St Monica's we believe it is important for students to attend each day so they can maximise their learning opportunities.

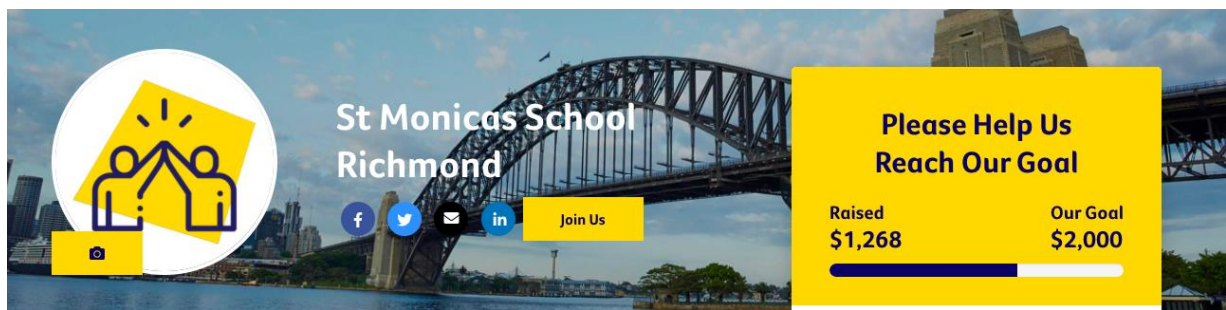
We appreciate your continued support in emphasising the need to be at school on time each and every day.

E-SAFETY

In an increasingly digital world, we need to ensure all students have the skills and confidence to engage online safely and enjoy the many positive benefits of the internet.

During the holidays many children will be engaging positively online however as parents we need to be mindful that our children are aware of what to do if they encounter content that makes them uncomfortable or troubled by.

Below are some tips from the e-safety commissioner in assisting children dealing with exposure to harmful content online

- Engage in your child's online activities – ask what apps, sites and games they're using and make sure they're age-appropriate
- Use parental controls on devices to help limit what your child is exposed to
- Help them report and block upsetting content they see on social media sites or apps
- Let them know they can come to you about anything upsetting they see online.



If you do encounter harmful or disturbing content online, you are asked to report it immediately to the social media platform it was seen on first, and then to eSafety at esafety.gov.au/report/illegal-harmful-content.

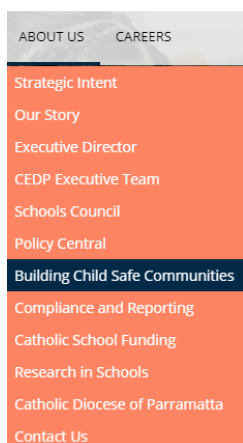

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES for Volunteers & Contractors



It is a diocesan requirement that parents who volunteer at school must complete the online CEDP Building Child Safe Communities undertaking form and training module.

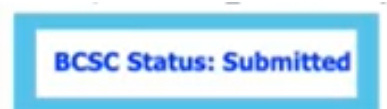
Click on "About Us"

Click on "Building Child Safe Communities".



Volunteers can now select multiple sites in one undertaking

Once submitted the applicant will receive a confirmation email.

When the application has been reviewed, the volunteer or contractor will receive a second email to notify of the status of either APPROVED, DECLINED or BARRED.



This process must be completed every 2 years. You will receive an automatic reminder email when it is expiring and another email when it expires.

START YOUR TRAINING

BCSC Undertaking Form and Training Module for Volunteers and Contractors

The purpose of this module is to inform you of the standards of behaviour and other requirements that must be adhered to when delivering services to children and students.

The undertaking should take no more than **5 minutes** to complete and the training module approximately **15 minutes**.

Once the form and training modules are submitted an automated email will be sent to you within 24 hours to confirm the status of your submission.

The undertaking form will expire within 2 years or when you WWCC expires (if applicable) whichever is sooner. At this time you will need to complete the Undertaking form and training module again. You will receive an automatic reminder email when this occurs.

I understand that I am required to sign my child in and out of the program each day. Written notification is required to allow another person to collect my child if they are not listed as an authorized contact.

I understand that my children may be required to participate in activities that may be physically and emotionally demanding. My children's participation in any activity is not compulsory. COSHC staff will duly exercise their Duty of Care.
