Welcome to week 4!

Over the next few weeks we have a feast of activities covering the sciences, sport, creative arts, speaking and maths competitions and literacy. Here are just a few of the events on our calendar and we will share more over the next few weeks as we continue our learning journeys across the school.



Yesterday on Monday 8th August we celebrated the Feast of St Mary MacKillop, our first Australian saint. It was wonderful to celebrate Mass as a school community in the church together and to be able to reflect on St Maryof the Cross' achievements as well as the obstacles she encountered. She was the cofounder of the Sisters of St Joseph and a tireless advocate of education and schools. At just 24, she established a school for children of the poor and underprivileged and

under her guidance, her Order went on to found schools not only across SA but also in Victoria, NSW and eventually New Zealand. St Mary refused to be daunted. With patience, a forgiving heart and trust in God, she managed to overcome whatever obstacles were put her way.



Next week we will celebrate Science Week beginning with an incursion entitled "A case of Emergency" The children will become forensic scientists looking for clues to solve an investigation using their critical and creative thinking skills. From Science week we move into Book Week. This year's theme is "Dreaming with Eyes Open."

For the first time in three years we are able to have our Book Week parade and invite our grandparents and special friends to share this occasion.

In Rio de Janeiro, July 26, 2013, during World Youth Day

celebrations, Pope Francis announced the following:

Saints Joachim and Anne were part of a long chain of people who had transmitted their love

for God, expressed in the warmth and love of family life. How important grandparents are for family life, for passing on the human and religious heritage which is so essential for each and every society! How important it is to have intergenerational exchanges and dialogue, especially within the context of the family. 
## A sneak preview of our Book Fair

## **BLUEBERRY AND OAT MUFFINS**



#### **Ingredients**

- 2 cups plain flour (white or wholemeal, or a mixture)
- 1 cup oats (quick or traditional)
- <sup>2</sup>⁄₃ cup brown sugar
- 1 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp baking soda
- 1½ cups reduced-fat Greek yoghurt
- 2 eggs, lightly beaten
- 50g margarine, melted, slightly cooled
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 cup fresh or frozen blueberries

#### Method

Pre-heat the oven to 180°C. Prepare muffin tins by greasing with margarine or spraying with oil.

Combine flour, oats, sugar, baking powder and baking soda in a bowl. Combine yogurt, eggs, margarine and vanilla in a second bowl. Fold the yoghurt mixture into the dry mixture and stir to combine. Gently fold in blueberries.

Spoon into muffin tins and bake for 20-25 minutes or until the top is golden and springs back when touched.
