Dear Parents and carers.

Welcome to week 7! Once again, we are working remotely as we experience another flood in the Hawkesbury. Thank you for your ongoing support and flexibility whilst we manage the severe weather conditions. At this stage we are hopeful that the school will be able to be reopened for those who can access the school on Thursday.

As the bridges are unlikely to be open by Thursday and many of our students and staff will still be impacted there will only be limited supervision at school. All stages have access to remote learning through Google classroom or See-saw and this will continue until access restrictions are lifted.

However, when we do return to school our protocols around COVID safe practices are relaxing. St Monica's will still continue to provide sanitiser and wipes in all learning spaces and have all high touch areas included in our daily cleaning schedule. You will no longer need to sign in using the QR code or wear a mask however if you are visiting the school you are asked to sign in at the office using our regular sign on procedures.

Excursions and sporting events will now be able to go ahead (weather permitting) however we will be mindful of keeping all members of our community as safe as we can. Details for individual events will be sent home as needed.

Assemblies will be able to proceed on Friday afternoons and parents of children receiving awards will now be able to attend. You will be notified by your class teacher via phone or email if your child is being acknowledged. Please note due to the current weather the assembly for this Friday has been postponed.

Some simple things to do during Lent.

The season of Lent covers the 40-day period before Easter. Each year it starts on a different date (because Easter moves around), although always on Ash Wednesday. It is said that the 40 days reflect Jesus' time of fasting and prayer in the wilderness after his baptism. Many people sacrifice something during Lent (like coffee, sweets, or shopping) as a way to tune their hearts back to God.

The **point** of sacrificing something important is to remember that God wants to be the most important aspect of our lives.

The three pillars of Lent are

- prayer,
- fasting, and
- almsgiving.

These three practices are to help us grow in holiness, and children can participate in all three, to various degrees. Since children don't typically have a lot of money for almsgiving, encouraging them to think of ways they can simply **give** to others. It may be a smile, their favourite treat, or a compliment.

With **fasting**, talk to them each individually and see what they would like to give up for a day. It could be dessert, TV, or a car ride home (taking the bus instead). They'll be encouraged to choose their fast. As for the prayer days, any child can pray!

Here are a few suggestions for each of the pillars of Lent.

GIVING

- do someone else's chores
- make another person's bed
- give someone a hug
- say something nice to someone

FASTING

- fast from TV for a set time
- fast from being sarcastic
- fast from saying mean things
- fast from gaming for a set time

PRAYING

- pray for someone who is sick
- pray for peace
- sing a song of praise to God
- read a Bible story



Rather than looking at Lent as a time of sacrifice and "giving something up", try to encourage children to DO something for others.



The Importance of Reading Daily

It has been wonderful to see so many students across the school take off in reading this term! Students should be reading each day at home as an opportunity to practise and consolidate the reading skills that they are learning at school. Students are encouraged to use their guided reading book from school and favourite books from home but don't forget there are many other ways to engage your child with reading including; following instructions for board games, following a recipe or travel brochures just to name a few. Why not ask your child what they would enjoy reading about and help them find something suitable. For our independent readers, the e-library is accessible through the school website with lots of great titles available. Our non-independent readers also have access to the **PM eCollection** for use at home. Kindy parents will be sent this information shortly. This is a fabulous online reading resource that will supplement home readers.

Supporting your beginning reader at home

Learning to read is tricky and helping your child at home can have its own challenges. Over the next few newsletters, we will include common questions and answers about reading with your beginning reader.



Yes – that is ok that students look at the pictures as they read! This is a strategy beginning readers use to help them understand the story and work out what the text may say. Praise your child for using the pictures to help them make meaning from the story - it shows they have an understanding that the story usually matches what they can see in the picture. Over time they will begin to use the pictures along other strategies such as looking at the initial sound or rereading the sentence and thinking about what word might make sense at that point.

MORNING AND AFTERNOON PICK-UP ARRANGEMENTS

• In the morning school drop off will remain the same with parents to say goodbye to children at the front school gate in Francis Street. We have found that this has reduced the incidents of separation anxiety and has increased the level of independence shown by the students. This has also been the overwhelming feedback we have received from the parent community.

• In the afternoon at the first bell (3:05pm) we will again open the school for pick up. The front school gate (Francis St) for children in Kindergarten, Stage 1 and 2 and side gate (Bourke St) for children in Stage 3. Children will be dismissed at 3:10pm.



Please note: All students will be seated outside the eldest child's dismissal area. Eg if you have children in Stages 2 and 3 they will all be seated together in the Stage 3 area and you would enter the school ground through the Bourke St gate to collect all your children.

Stage 2 will be seated outside the library, Stage 1 outside their learning space and Kindergarten outside their learning space.

This process assists us with limiting the movement of adults inside the school grounds. We ask that you do not mingle with other parents after pick up or chat with your child's teacher but exit the playground promptly to ensure social distancing rules are maintained as we are mindful that even though restrictions are easing we need to keep everyone safe.

A reminder that in the event you are late to school please bring your child to the front office and sign them in. Your child will be given a blue late note pass at the office and will be asked to take that to their teacher. Parents are asked NOT to accompany children to the class, any messages the teacher needs to know will be passed on by the office staff.

As always, any questions or concerns please notify the school office or your child's teacher.
