#### **Confirmation**

At his Baptism, Jesus received the Holy Spirit, which gave him the strength to resist the temptations of the devil in the desert. Jesus promised his disciples that after his Ascension they would receive the Holy Spirit too. This happened at Pentecost, when the disciples were given the courage and the power to spread the good news about Jesus to the entire world.

Confirmation completes the Sacrament of Baptism, as when, for example, the Apostles Peter and John prayed over some people who had previously been baptised, that they might receive the Holy Spirit. Eventually, the Church began baptising and confirming new converts during the Easter Vigil.

Before being confirmed, someone who was baptised as a child renews the vows their parents and godparents made for them on their behalf during their Baptism. As a sign of new life, a (new) name is given to a person as they are baptised. When they are later confirmed, they might add another name to reflect their decision to follow Christ as an adult. The confirmation name is usually that of a saint that they admire.

When we were born again as Christians through Baptism, we receive the Holy Spirit. Through Confirmation, the presence of the Holy Spirit is confirmed, or strengthened, in us.

#### NUMERACY AT ST MONICA'S

Family participation in learning is one of the most accurate predictors of a child's success in school and beyond. Providing opportunities to discuss and engage in mathematics supports your child's learning in and out of school. Your child will also begin to connect the importance of maths with their everyday activities, such as navigating public transport, comparing and choosing the best item to buy in stores, setting a budget, and cooking. Talk positively about maths so your child also values it.

Encourage your child to talk about how they might work out maths problems. This helps boost their confidence and deepens their understanding. Today, the focus is on recognising that there are multiple ways to get an answer, and being able to explain how and why you chose the approach you did. Try to focus on the process and not the outcome.

#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

#### My child has lost their order form, so I don't have their shootkey.

• Please call MSP Photography on 9831 5505 and they can let you know their shootkey

#### How do I order family photos?

• Each family has been issued with a corresponding shootkey for a family photo. Order the family pack using the eldest child's order form/shootkey in the family section and complete the order reference number/family details in the relevant section on their order form. There is no need to record it on all siblings' forms. Please remind your children to have their sibling photo on the day.

#### Can I still order if my partner and I have separated?

• Yes, you can use the same shootkey provided on the order form to order for your child. Any students with multiple orders processed will have their photographs sent in separate satchels to the school. There is a section on the order form for you to tick "Split Family" so we can place a "Mum's Order" or "Dad's Order" sticker on the satchel. If you think there may be a problem receiving the photographs or you don't have an order form or shootkey, please phone MSP Photography on 9831 5505 so they can assist you.

#### I didn't receive an order reference number but the money has been taken out of my account.

• Your order will be automatically received in our system. Simply send your child to school with their order form on photo day.

#### I do not have internet access and / or I do not have a credit card to make payment online.

• The school office has blank envelopes – Individual (Green) and Family envelopes (Orange) for you to pay by cash. Please insert the cash and have your child return the envelope on photo day.

#### COMPASS IS OUR PRIMARY PARENT COMMUNICATION TOOL FOR DAY-TO-DAY OPERATIONAL MATTERS, UPCOMING EVENTS, NOTICES AND NOTIFICATIONS SO IT IS ESSENTIAL THAT ALL PARENTS DOWNLOAD THE APP.

It is more important than ever that we are able to communicate effectively, especially when it involves the safety of our children. If you haven't already, we ask that you download the Compass app onto your device for either Apple or Android. Compass is a web-based system allowing you to access up-to-date and meaningful information about our school and your child's progress. Compass includes many different features, including the ability to:

- Be informed of important updates, events and reminders
- View your child's timetable
- Review your child's attendance
- Provide explanations for periods of absence
- Update your contact details



Compass is accessible on any modern web browser (Internet Explorer, Firefox, Chrome, Safari) or by using the Compass iOS or Android apps.

NB: Skoolbag will be phased out for school use as we transition to Compass in 2022.

St Monica's is entering the Hawkesbury Show Painted Pig Competition.




Kindy - Year 2, Years 3 - 4 and Years 5 - 6.
